Uckfield Festival

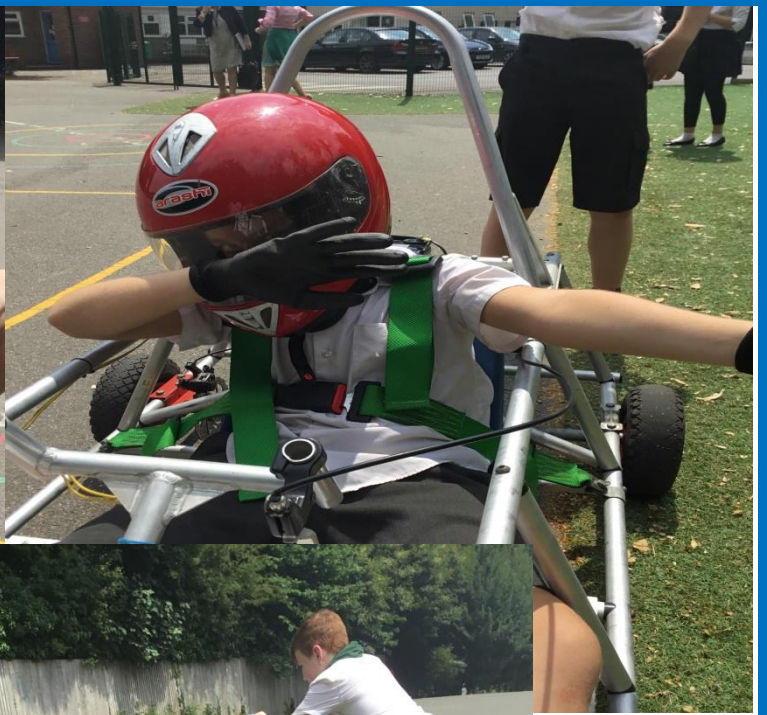
