#### **Remembrance Assembly**







Last week we held our Remembrance Assembly at school. All the children made their own poppies for our Remembrance Centenary display. Woodpecker Class created a beautiful whole class freeze representing the poppies of Flanders Field. The freeze was made up of 100 poppies representing the centenary year and 10 crosses to represent each decade, now displayed in our school office. The children read poems and prayers and the staff talked to the children about this special centenary year commemorating the end of World War 1, why we use poppies to remember, and why it is so important for us to remember the courageous people who gave up their lives for us. We ended with a few moments of silent reflection with our own prayers. All the children were incredibly respectful.





## The Weeping Window

It was a real honour to be asked to contribute to the weeping window display at St Bartholomew's Church. The whole school took part in making a poppy for the display and a few of our year 5 pupils together with Mrs Wilson and Mrs Whitmey walked down to the church to plant the poppies at the memorial in



the church yard. They were met by the army chaplain from the 11<sup>th</sup> Signals Regiment who conducted the service on Remembrance Day at the church and one of the officers from the squadron. The children were thrilled to be taking part in the planting and asked the Chaplain and Squadron Officer lots of relevant questions. They represented Bonners School beautifully and we were really proud of them. Thank you to Angie Welton the church administrator for Maresfield and Nutley Churches for organising this event for the whole community. Angie said, **'The children were so polite and such a credit to their school and teachers,'** and she also thanked the rest of the school for taking time to make the beautiful poppies in preparation for the church service.


