Forest school has been fabulous this term and the children sat round the campfire singing songs and making decorations for a Christmas tree using materials resources. Miss Vickery was delighted to receive parents at "stay and share" and the children proudly showed how much progress they have made work to mums dad and family.







Robins

This term in Robin Class we have been Galloping Globe Trotters journeying around the world exploring transport past and present. We developed our writing skills when exploring the magical book 'The Journey' By Aaron Becker. During our topic, we were thrilled to have a visit from a real pilot who told us all about her experiences flying aeroplanes. We also had an amazing adventure to St Lucia on our flight from Robin Class airport with the help of our very own British Airways Air Stewardess! Our topic ended with a journey to Bethlehem with a wonderful performance of the Nativity 'It's a party'







Woodpeckers

This term, our learning journey, 'In the Spot Light!' has involved a lot of great science and art work. We began with a 'hands on day.' The children explored light boxes, made Newton spinners and blew bubbles in the sunny playground, in order to begin to explore how light behaves and works. After this, they learnt about transparent, translucent and opaque materials and made window pictures and stained glass windows to reinforce this knowledge. Next, the children looked at and explored shadows. The weather wasn't favourable in helping us explore this outside, so we make foil figures and used torches to create shadow figures instead.

Our Fabulous finish involved having a premiere for the wonderful shadow puppet shows that the class have been working on for a few weeks. They developed group skills whilst creating their own Fable play scripts and designing and making their theatres and puppets. We have filmed these performances and they are fantastic. They really enjoyed this! Please look out for these on the Learning Platform early next term.







Kingfishers

Kingfishers' learning journey this term was North American, a mix of Geography and History.

Our WOW starter consisted of reading the legend and then making dream catchers which are hanging around our classroom. Children learnt about the continent of North America, wrote Native American legends, newspaper reports about the Gold Rush and we even wrote and video recorded our own 'Kingfisher's News at 10' programme. Children particularly enjoyed the art aspects of this learning journey and developed Native American weaving techniques and make giant totem poles. As our fabulous finish, we showed our Native American tribal dance to parents who then stayed to look at children's work.







Owls

In Owl Class this term, through our learning Journey 'Northern Lights' we've found out all about Scandinavia. The children have learnt about how the Northern Lights are formed, and done some lovely art work on them. They've researched one of the 5 Scandinavian countries and made a poster about it. We've found out that Tromso, in north Norway, gets no sun for 6 weeks, and we've written an article on how to survive the long, cold, dark winters there. We've been reading the book 'Northern Lights' by Philip Pullman, and the children have done some brilliant writing based on this about a girl called Alma who disappears. We've done an oil pastel of 'The Scream' by Edvard Munch' and as our fantastic finish, have made and decorated gingerbread houses, as is the Norwegian custom.
